# YHSI Goals

The goal of YHSI grants is to increase state and local capacity to better serve youth and create projects that are responsive to the needs of youth at-risk of or experiencing homelessness in the community

# What are the objectives of the YHSI grant?

- Improve the capacity of youth in the community
- Establish partnerships
- Improve the coordinated entry system in a community
- Improve data collection and use between systems that work with youth
- Assess, address, and improve equity and decrease disparities in the youth homeless response system

# What funding is available?

**Total Funding Available: \$50M**

Per project funding availability: \$200,000 to \$1M

Max Award doubles  
if application covers  
2 or more CoCs or  
is statewide

Funding Category	Maximum Award
Planning & Partnerships	\$400,000
Data	\$300,000
Coordinated Entry	\$200,000
Racial & Gender Equity	\$200,000

# Who is eligible to apply?

- State, county, and local governments
- Tribal governments
- Tribally Designated Housing Entities (TDHEs)
- Non-profit organizations

Funding and scoring incentives are offered for applications that cover a larger geographic area (e.g. statewide projects)

★ Current and former YHDP recipients may receive YHSI grants

# How is YHSI different from YHDP?

	YHDP	YHSI
<b>Grant activities</b>	Housing, Services, Planning, HMIS, Coordinated Entry	Planning & Partnerships, Coordinated Entry, Data, and Racial & Gender Equity
<b>Grant length</b>	24 months after 6-month planning period	30 months
<b>Grant amount</b>	\$600,000-\$15M	\$200,000-\$2M
<b>Renewable funds</b>	All funds, except planning and construction funds, are eligible for renewal under future CoC competitions	Not renewable
<b>Eligible applicants</b>	Limited to CoC collaborative applicants	Not limited to CoC collaborative applicants

# Planning and Partnerships

- Developing community-wide or region-wide partnerships to better identify and understand the needs of youth at-risk of or experiencing homelessness
- Compensating Youth Action Board members for their work on the YHSI grant
- Costs associated with hosting local conferences
- Engagement, training, and cross-community coordination of youth with lived experience for participation in YHSI grant activities
- Costs associated with cross-training and developing community-wide policies and practices for preventing or quickly resolving youth homelessness
- System mapping and planning

# Data

- Upgrading, customizing, and enhancing the HMIS to better collect and report data on youth
- Recruiting new participants to HMIS
- Technical, legal, and planning costs associated with creating data matches or data integration between different data collection sources, such as HMIS and school district data
- Developing and implementing evaluation and analysis strategies related to youth homelessness

# Coordinated Entry Systems

- Establishment or improvement of youth-specific CES access points
- Development or improvement of a youth-specific assessment tool
- Creating a prioritization plan for youth experiencing homelessness within the larger CES
- Activities related to better understanding needs of youth experiencing homelessness within CES
- Developing and implementing an ongoing evaluation process for the CES
- Recruitment of additional projects to send and receive referrals from CES

# Racial and Gender Equity

- Costs associated with conducting a community-wide racial and gender equity assessment
- Costs associated with conducting a needs analysis of youth experiencing homelessness, including the needs of youth subpopulations such as minors, BIPOC youth, LGBTQIA+, pregnant and parenting youth
- Costs associated with implementing policies, procedures, and cultural change associated with outcomes of a youth homelessness equity analysis
- Costs associated with developing an evaluation framework for current and future projects serving youth experiencing homelessness, including outcomes related to racial equity and LGBTQIA+ equity

# Potential Project Examples

- Engage and hire youth with lived experience of homelessness for project activities
- Create a statewide exit strategy for youth exiting the child welfare system
- Work with local school districts to create a data-sharing agreement to identify youth experiencing homelessness
- Conduct a series of focus groups and surveys with youth and service providers to understand gaps in current CES
- Develop an awareness campaign on youth homelessness to recruit additional partners and YAB members
